Don't worry ! Our International Relations team will help you with administrative procedures.

Here is a diagram that summarizes the steps:



Students of the UE, the EEA and Switzerland do not need a visa to study in France. Other international students will need to apply for a 2-year mobility study visa (visa étudiant-mobilité). The letter of acceptance from IAE Pau Bayonne will need to be submitted with your visa application to the French consulate of your country. Please note that visa procedure can take weeks.

PRE-DEPARTURE PLANNING

MEET YOUR BUDDY !

"Buddy System" is a mentoring programme which connects an international student with a local student.

A Buddy helps you at your arrival with the administrative procedures (accommodation, bank, bus card...etc) but also helps you to get integrated (practicing the language, discovering the culture, the city, etc). This is not compulsory, but we truly encourage you to try it! You will be introduced to your Buddy at your arrival.

First, you will have to pay the CVEC (Contribution de Vie Etudiante et de Campus – student life and campus fee) online: www.cvec.etudiant.gouv.fr

Once you are registered, you will receive the invoice to pay the tuition fees. You can transfer it directly to the university bank account.

That's it!

You can now get your AquiPASS student card, your digital UPPA account, your student email address and your enrollment certificate (=certificate de scolarité). Certificat de Scolarité is a very important document.

You should always keep it with you for all administrative procedures.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION about housing in France

CHARTER

Students are expected to behave in a responsible manner. You will be asked to sign a Charter for a Responsible Stay.

INVENTORY

When you move into an accommodation, you have to agree on an inventory of fixtures with the landlord or estate agent. It outlines the condition of the flat and any equipment such as dishwashers, furniture, etc. The inventory should be as accurate as possible to avoid any disputes at the end of the tenancy and should be drawn up on the tenant's arrival and departure.

INSURANCE

Housing insurance has to be taken out within 24 hours of securing accommodation.

GUARANTOR

When you rent accommodation in France, you need a guarantor.

- For foreign students under 30 years old:

"Visale" can help you get a guarantor for free : www.visale.fr

- For students over 30 years old:

Plan to pay the whole year's rent in one or two payments. You can also try "garant me" : https://garantme.fr/en



•If you have a disagreement with the landlord, the family, the residence or the flatmate, you will have to handle the problem by yourself. Otherwise, you can ask for help from the IAE staff within reasonable limits.

•When you leave your accommodation, you must give your landlord notice. This letter must be sent by registered letter and must state the date on which you intend to leave your accommodation. It must be given in advance and the period is subject to the terms of the tenancy agreement. It can range from 1 month to 3 months' notice, so read your tenancy agreement carefully!

4 - VALIDATE YOUR VISA

Within 3 months after your arrival in France you must validate your VLS-TS VISA. Failure to do so can lead to problems with OFII (French Immigration and Integration Office).

5 - HEALTH

In France, the social security system (CPAM) covers a part of your healthcare expenses :

- 70% for the General Practitioner
- 70% or less for specialists

An affiliation is compulsory for all non-European international students as soon as they register at the university. The rest of your expenses can be covered by your complementary student health insurance, or by a private international insurance (if you choose to have one).



I DON'T NEED FRENCH SOCIAL SECURITY

European students already covered by their country's social security should obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) from their social security services before coming to France.

This card ensures that students have health insurance in Europe, and also includes health cover for trips within The European Economic Area or Switzerland.

If they have healthcare expenses, they will have to provide a copy of their EHIC, their RIB and the

treatment form to their country's social security services in order to be repaid.

Specific measures apply to students from Ouebec. If you are in France as part of the BCI program, you are exempt from the system that applies for French students. All you have to do is to obtain a SE-401- Q-106 form before you leave your country.

Carte Vitale?

The Carte Vitale is a green health card you will receive once you get registered within the CPAM system. It shows that you are **covered** by the French social security system and allows you to be reimbursed for your healthcare expenses.



You should always keep it with you in your wallet !

6 - HOUSING BENEFIT

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Aide au Logement - Caf

All students, including international students, may benefit from a financial help to pay their rent.

Once the rental contract is signed, students can apply for the housing benefit online : www.caf.fr

- Copy of your passport and your validated VISA
- Copy of your official birth certificate and the official French translation
- French Social Security statement if you're under 28, or private health insurance statement if you're over 28 or copy of European Health Card
- Certificat de scolarité
- French housing certificate



Are you eligible ?

You will be eligible for financial assistance if : •You are staying more than 9 months in your accommodation

•You are an European citizen

•You are a non-European member but you have a valid French residence permit

Note 1 : if your VISA states "Dispensé temporaire de carte de séjour" and/or you don't have the OFII stamp, you will not be entitled to this benefit. Note 2 : allocation of housing benefit is not automatic.

What are these important abbreviations ?

RIB - Relevé d'Identité Bancaire Your bank account details.

Certificat de Scolarité

This is the enrollment certificate. This paper states that you are an official UPPA student for this academic year.

<u>CPAM</u>

Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie French Social Security that ensures a part of reimbursement for healthcare expenses.

<u>CAF - Caisse d'Allocation Familiale</u> Government organisation that provides rental subsidies

<u>EHIC</u>

European Health Insurance Card Issued by the social security system of your country if you are European citizen.

AQUIPASS STUDENT CARD

The AquiPASS card is issued after registration at the IAE. This card is free of charge but in case of loss or theft, it is your responsibility to pay for reissuing a new card.

The AquiPASS card is valid for one academic year. It is updated each year for re-enrolment. This update is necessary to renew access to the University library and restaurant.

The AquiPASS card is also a convenient and safe way of payment on the Campus thanks to the Izly system. Izly is an online application where you can credit with euros your student card.

Here some ideas on how to find your place and get by in your new environment...

CULTURE AND ARTS

France is known for its cultural and artistic wealth, as is Bayonne: cinemas, theatres, museums and an exciting nightlife are waiting for you! Students get discounts for almost all cultural events and places !

CINEMAS

Do you like watching movies ? If so, Bayonne is the right place!

ART HOUSE CINEMAS

L'Atalante in Bayonne provide many different films in original versions (with French subtitles). It belongs and corresponds to the rich tradition of French cinema. L'Atalante also includes a bar and a small gallery to visit.

The cinema Le Royal in Biarritz is also a very good choice for original versions. Once a month they organize a special screening "Lost in Frenchlation", they screen a french movie with english subtitles.

BLOCKBUSTER CINEMAS

Moreover, you can find the Cinema Mega CGR in Bayonne's South and the Monciné in Anglet, where you can choose from a wide variety of films, mostly dubbed in French.

THE BASQUE MUSEUM

Euskara badakizu ? Do you speak Basque ? In Bayonne daily life, the Basque culture is very important.

To get to know more about the Basque culture and the city's history it is highly recommended to visit the Basque Museum ! Its exhibitions change often and deal with different topics of historic and contemporary life.

Q ART

For art lovers, Bayonne has an art museum and several small art galleries worth visiting.

The Museum Bonnat-Helleu (currently under renovation) is specialized in fine arts.

OTHER MUSEUMS

If you are interested in exhibitions, collections and excursions on natural history and wildlife, you can visit the Ansot Natural History Museum, located in a natural park and near the Nive river.

For sea-lovers it may be interesting to visit the **Biarritz Sea Museum and Aquarium** and watch the seals being fed ! It is also a perfect spot to enjoy the ocean view !

LOCATIONS & NIGHT LIFE

In Bayonne and its surroundings there is many concerts and events. For example :

• THE ATABAL (BIARRITZ)

The Atabal in Biarritz offers a varied programme throughout the year and organizes various concerts and events (rock, alternative, pop...), small art exhibitions and music classes. You will certainly find something you like !

ECURIES DE BAROJA AND QUINTAO (ANGLET)

Ecuries de Baroja in Anglet also offers a variety of concerts and cultural events in a special atmosphere : the building is a beautifully renovated former horse stable and hosts various artist's studios and music groups.

The Quintaou in Anglet with its modern architecture is a good place for many events (dance gatherings, shows, conferences) and includes also a restaurant and café.

PETIT BAYONNE

In Petit Bayonne you will find many bars and peñas, where concerts and sometimes also theatre plays take place.

The Kalostrape in the Rue Marengo is a Basque cultural centre which offers many different events (DJs, concerts, language exchanges, cultural events) and is definitely a place to visit !

The Magneto event takes place in a former castle bunker, and its rather underground atmosphere (mainly rock concerts) is sure to please.

GRAND BAYONNE

Are you a musician ?

In the Caveau des Augustins in Grand Bayonne you can join the jam sessions ! Jazz, swing and 60s/70s music is presented. To find a band to play in, visit the BIJ (see below).

The Irish pub Katie Daly's next to the

town hall is a place where the foreigners of Bayonne gather in the evenings – and where you can order in English !

NIGHTCLUBS

Bayonne students usually go to the bars when they are going out. But if you are a nightclub lover there are some places like **the Arrena** or **the Jungle Café** where you can dance until sunrise. If you are brave enough, you can party on the French-Spanish border at La **Nuba**, the largest nightclub in the Basque Country.



BAYONNE CITY LIFE BAYONNE GASTRONOMY

As you will soon learn, food is very important for the Bayonnais and French people in general. Here some information on Bayonne and French gastronomy.

IN THE RESTAURANT

Generally, a restaurant menu is composed of three dishes (entrée, plat, dessert), but know that you can choose to order only the first course – entrée and the main course or the main course and the dessert. Water and bread are included in the menu.

In France, tips are appreciated but not required.

At the end of the meal, either you pay at your table or at the counter, it will depend on the restaurant.

MARKETS

Enjoy the traditional food market each Saturday near les Halles in Bayonne. Here you can buy fresh fruits and vegetables, wine, cheese and other regional products. And it is the meeting point of the town's inhabitants.

Drinking excessively will cause harm to your body and mind. Please drink mindfully.

WORKING IN FRANCE

Every foreign student has the right to work while studying in France. This right applies to all students in France. If you are not an EU citizen and you want to work, you must have a student resident permit



French law authorises foreign students to an auxiliary work of 964 hours during the year, the equivalent of 60% of the legal work year. It can only be auxiliary income. When you work in France, if you are a student or not, you are guaranteed a minimum wage by law. It is commonly called the SMIC (Salaire Minimum Interprofessionnel de Croissance - the

minimum wage). It is 11,52€ gross per hour.

This wage is gross; you have to deduct mandatory social charges (about 20%) to find out how much you really take home: 9,11€ hour.

The Autorisation Provisoire de Travail (APT -Temporary Work Permit) is no longer needed to work while studying, except for Algerian students, whose status remains defined by the Franco-Algerian agreement of December 27th, 1968.

BUREAU INFORMATION JEUNESSE

The first address in Bayonne to find a part time job is the "BIJ" (Bureau Information Jeunesse) the youth's information office.

There you can find small jobs (like Babysitting, private lessons, etc.) by filling out a form that will be accessible to the public.

The BIJ also helps you with your CV in French and provides information about events, trainings et cetera.


